Candidates for election as Second Vice President or Director Elected Nationally must complete this form and submit it to the Executive Director at the principal headquarters of DRI by 5:00 PM (CDT) on July 1st of the year in which the election is held.

National Director Requirements - Directors Elected Nationally or by Region must be Individual Members of the Corporation admitted to the practice of law. Each such director must meet the following qualifications at the time of election: (a) The candidate shall have been a DRI member for a total of at least five (5) years, and (b) The candidate shall have been a member of at least one DRI substantive law committee for at least three (3) years, and (c) The candidate must have registered for and attended at least one (1) DRI Annual Meeting within the previous three (3) years, and, within the three (3) years prior to the final day of the Annual Meeting, the candidate must have 1) registered for and attended at least two (2) DRI seminars, or 2) registered for and attended one (1) DRI seminar and one (1) DRI Regional Meeting.

Describe your goals if you are elected to the above position.

If I am elected to a National Director position, one of my goals includes increasing and maintaining the engagement of younger female attorneys in DRI, SLDOs and in the practice of law. I have observed many young women who have potential to be strong local and national leaders, who decide to turn away from the defense bar, and we lose these young leaders from DRI and SLDOs. Another goal is to increase the engagement of younger lawyers in DRI and SLDOs. I have noticed many associates are unwilling to leave their desks to see the benefits of engaging in DRI. My final goal is to continue the work being done to integrate the SLCs and SLDOs. Many committee members are not members of their SLDOs. It is important for us as leaders in DRI to continue to integrate these two important aspects of the organization. These goals encompass increasing membership as well as engagement of new members.

What do you believe is the most important issue confronting the defense bar?

The most important issue confronting the defense bar is the ability to attract and retain quality lawyers and engage them in the practice of law. By engaging, the challenge is twofold: (1) these young lawyers need to get away from their desks

and become involved in organizations like DRI and (2) for their firms to support these efforts of the young lawyers.
