Describe your goals if you are elected to the above position.

My goal is to help shape the future of DRI. The COVID-19 pandemic has been difficult, but it has caused law firms and clients alike to re-think the practice of law. Where we work, how we practice, and the ways we communicate are changing, and legal organizations will have to adapt. DRI seems to be embracing and preparing for that future, and I believe it will be ready to lead and grow with its members.

What do you believe is the most important issue confronting the defense bar?

Jury trials are scarce, big corporations are generally unsympathetic, and the rise of social media has increased pressure on potential defendants in civil litigation. I perceive that defense lawyers are perhaps falling behind the plaintiff bar when it comes to working together. The members of the plaintiff bar seem to do a good job collaborating with one another, sharing evidence and tips to gain advantages in litigation, and leveraging resources against defendants. Defense lawyers should continue to find ways to collaborate. For big law firms, many of the older partners are leaving the practice and younger lawyers are being asked to fill those shoes in an increasingly stressful, competitive environment. New associates may have less interest in following the traditional path to partnership, so defense firms may have to re-think law firm structure and organization.

Define the appropriate role for DRI as the national defense bar organization.

DRI is the lead national defense organization and it's open to everyone. It should continue to focus on helping defense lawyers be skilled, prepared, knowledgeable, client focused, and service oriented.
